



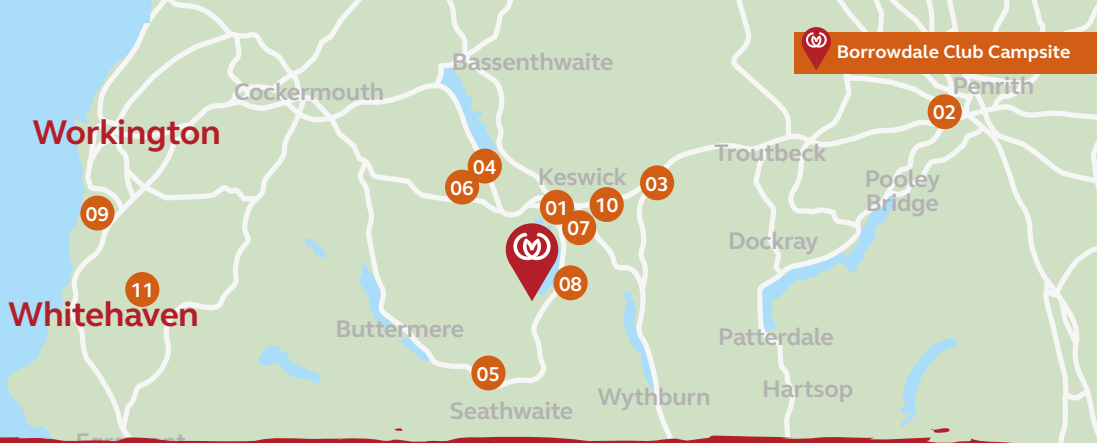

The local area and Lake District offer fantastic walking opportunities in spectacular scenery.

The nearest route to this site is route 71, which is part of the Sea to Sea (C2C) route from Whitehaven to Workington to Newcastle or Sunderland.

10 Keswick

An attractive market town full of character, offering a great variety of shops, cafés, pubs and restaurants, alongside fascinating museums and historic sites.

11 Whitehaven

One of England's 40 Gem Towns and one of the prettiest in Cumbria, lined with elegant architecture which frames a bustling market square; discover great shopping, unique history and an abundance of activities.



Visitor's top tips

Most of the pubs and shops in Keswick allow dogs, and it has actually been voted the UK's most dog-friendly town!

On site, there are fantastic red squirrel and birdwatching opportunities.

Lingholm Garden is lovely, with a Walled Garden, Café and Alpacas which you can take for a walk

The nearby Borrowdale, Mary Mount and Lodore Falls hotels are all lovely for an evening meal or afternoon tea, and are also dog-friendly.

Visit Yew Tree Farm in Rosthwaite, which has a lovely farm shop and cafe.

Lowther Castle was a fantastic day out.

Follow the side gate out of site, and walk to the nearby lake for amazing scenery; walk back through National Trust Manesty Woods to spot deer.

From site, you can walk straight up the Catbells, or a little further to Castle Crag for spectacular views – well worth the effort!

Keswick Market offers a wide variety of interesting and unique stalls.

The National Trust's Wordsworth House, Aira Force and all the sites surrounding the site are must-sees!

Close by

Supermarkets

Co-op in Keswick, 5.4 miles, Booths (local grocery shop), 5.2 miles.

Petrol Station

Texaco 6 miles and Shell 6.2 miles, both in Keswick.

Cashpoint

Barclays, Post Office, Cumberland Building Society and Booths Supermarket in Keswick.

Public transport

The Keswick/Buttermere bus stops at the site gate. The Borrowdale bus service runs from Keswick to Seatoller and stops at the Lodore Falls Hotel and Grange Bridge.

Keswick, 6 miles.

Launch service

There is a regular launch service around Derwentwater. The nearest landing stage is at High Brandelhow, approximately a 25 minute walk. Tickets at discount prices are available from the Site Staff.
