
## **Explore**

10 Weymouth

Often voted as one of the top 10 beach destinations in Europe, this gorgeous seaside town is adorned by an arc of fine golden sand, offering an eclectic mix of popular attractions for all ages.

11 Dorchester

Dorset's vibrant county town, there is a brilliant selection of shops, museums and eateries, in addition to historic sites and great sightseeing.





Moreton is only a mile away, visit the beautiful church where 'Lawrence of Arabia' is buried. There is also a lovely tea shop with garden seating.

Lulworth Cove and Durdle Door are only a short drive away, they're stunning and well worth a visit.

There is an excellent natural spring in the village which will delight kids.

The train station is so convenient for visiting Weymouth, Bournemouth, Dorchester and plenty of other places.

The dog-friendly Frampton Arms Pub is very close to site, serving excellent food with great service.

The National Trust's Kingston Lacy House, Corfe Castle, Hardy's Cottage, Studland Bay, Old Harry Rocks and Clouds Hill sites are all worth visiting.

The Tank Museum is a really interesting day out, presenting 300 vehicles from WW1 to present day.

The Swanage Railway makes a lovely family day out.
