



Go Falconry

Get up close to some of the world's elegant and beautiful birds of prey.

2 South Devon Railway

This seven-mile line runs along the stunning valley of the River Dart between Buckfastleigh and Totnes.

3 Paignton Zoo

Explore one of England's largest zoos with over 2,000 animals and 80 acres of beautiful botanical gardens.

4 Compton Castle

A haven of tranquillity with 30 acres of ancient gardens, woodlands and ancient pathways to explore.

5 Stover Country Park

Explore 114 acres of tranquil woodland, heathland, grassland, lake and marsh, home to an abundance of wildlife.

6 Pennywell Farm


Pennywell is packed full of animals, activities such as pig racing and feeding, deer feeding, goat walking, ferret racing, farm rides, shows and displays, this attraction is well worth the visit!

Shaldon Wildlife Trust

Set in an acre of woodland above the attractive coastal village of Shaldon, this lovely wildlife trust looks after and homes some of the rarest and most endangered animals in the world.

11 Torquay


Part of the UNESCO-listed English Riviera, this traditional seaside town is home to a gorgeous sandy beach, international marina and bustling, picturesque harbour.

Visitor's top tips

Just a short drive away from the campsite is the famous English Riviera of Torbay, with loads of scenic attractions to enjoy.

For food we found the Union Inn in Denbury excellent, although the Two Mile Oak, half a mile from the site is also good - both are dog friendly.

Golfers will enjoy the Dainton Park 18-hole golf course nearby.

We loved visiting the National Trust sites in the area – our favourites were Compton Castle and Greenway House. Newton Abbot is a lovely old market town and is good for fishing. Totnes has a beautiful high street filled with quirky shops to browse and lovely dog-friendly cafés. Stoke Gabriel offers spectacular views!

We had a wonderful day out on the Dartmouth Steam Railway's Round Robin, which includes a river boat, steam train and bus, visiting Paignton, Dartmouth and Totnes.

If you have time, definitely make a visit to Exeter or Plymouth.
