Walk

Grafham Water

Nestled within 1,500 acres of stunning countryside, there are nine miles of beautifullymaintained tracks around the reservoir, plus lots of unique and picturesque nature trails to follow.

9 Brampton Wood

A magical and ancient woodland which is perfect for exploring at any time of year, where you can discover a myriad of flora, wildlife and colourful insects through a series of scenic pathways.

10 National Cycle Network

The site is situated on Route 12 of the National Cycle Network, which links with Route 51 at Huntingdon and St Neots, taking you to Cambridge, Peterborough and Milton Keynes.

11 Cambridge

Set on the River Cam. this beautiful city is famed for its world-class university, also home to lovely parks, an abundance of museums, incredible architecture and a colourful market.

12 Ely

Steeped in heritage, this wonderful city blends its plethora of historic sites with a compact city centre, delightful markets and a magnificent Cathedral.





Visitor's top tips

Visit Northampton, home to lots of historic sites, unique architecture and lovely parks.

Cambridge is well worth a visit and only about half an hour away, parking is expensive so use the park and ride.

In April go to Paxton Pits Nature reserve to see and hear Nightingales.

Look out for the resident owl on site!

The Wheatsheaf pub at Perry was excellent – good food and great service.

There's a lovely pizza van which visits site every Friday evening – the food is delicious!

Huntingdon is a wonderful day out, with lots of shops, museums, scenic walks and eateries.

The National Trust's Wimpole Estate is lovely – an impressive mansion with beautiful gardens and a farm.

Take a walk around the reservoir, it's absolutely stunning and is so peaceful.

Cinnamon in Grafham served one of the best curries we have ever had!

The local community pub is just a 10 to 15 minute walk from site.

Visit the English Heritage Denny Abbey and Farmland Museum.
